■ PURPOSE

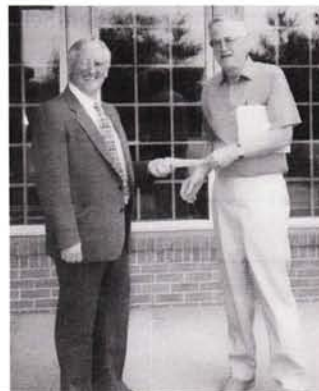
